New/Reactivated FFA Alumni Chapter Grant

Aim & Purpose:

The purpose of the New/Reactivated FFA Alumni Chapter Grant is to provide financial assistance to Wisconsin FFA Alumni chapters who have newly established/or reactivated within the last year. This grant will provide aid to the chapter for start-up or reactivation expenses so that the chapter can effectively support and/or promote agricultural education in their community. The applying chapter must provide an identifiable purpose for the grant that is in align with the purpose of an FFA Alumni.

Grants will be in the amount of \$550 per FFA Alumni Chapter.

Criteria:

- The applying FFA Alumni chapter must have been considered inactive for a minimum of 5 consecutive membership years in order to be eligible to apply for this grant.
- The grant is available during the first year of the applying chapter's chartering or re-chartering date.
- The Chapter must have submitted all required membership paperwork to the Executive Director of the Wisconsin FFA Alumni Association along with all paid state and national dues.
- The Chapter can complete the grant application anytime during the year.
- The grant will be awarded after review by the membership committee and approval of the Wisconsin FFA Alumni Council at the next council meeting that occurs after the grant application has been received.
- The Chapter cannot receive the New/Reactivated FFA Alumni Chapter Grant and the FFA Alumni Chapter Support Grant in the same year.

Follow-up Criteria:

- The chapter must submit the Follow-up Grant Review. The Follow-up Grant Review must be sent to the Wisconsin FFA Alumni Association, W2680 US Hwy 10, Granton, WI 54436 no later than two months after chapter's project is complete.
- The Wisconsin FFA Alumni suggests that the chapter creates a display to be used at the following year's State FFA Alumni Convention to highlight the successes of the chapter due to receiving the grant.

Availability of this grant is subject to approval by the: Membership Committee and the Wisconsin FFA Alumni Council and based on the Wisconsin FFA Alumni Association budget.
